For individuals:

- Please **print page 3 only**.
- **Sign** the letter. You **MUST** include:
 - Your **signature**.
 - Your **name** legibly printed.
 - Your complete **mailing address** including your zip code.
- Make **any additional comments** you would like to include in the white space below your signature and address.
- **Deliver** your letter in one of these ways:
 - If you are working with a group, **give your signed letter** to the person in your group who is coordinating this action.
 - **OR: Scan and email it** to info@indivisible.org by mid-day on Thursday, Jan. 3, 2018.
 - **OR: Bring it** to our **“Whose House? Our House!” event** at The Block off Biltmore, 39 South Market Street, Asheville, NC 28801, **5:30 PM to 7:00 PM on Thursday, Jan. 3, 2018**. We would love to see you there!
 - **OR: Mail it** to us at PO Box 593, Asheville, NC 28802. In order to allow time for delivery over the holidays it should be postmarked **by Dec. 31, 2018**.
 - **OR: Bring it** to Representative **Meadows’s office** at the Henderson County Court House, 200 N. Grove Street, Suite 90, in Hendersonville, no later than **2:30 PM on Friday, Jan. 4, 2018**, and give it to the Indivisible AVL folks there who will personally deliver the stack of resolutions to a Meadows staffer at 3:00 PM.*

** NOTE: We tried repeatedly to schedule an appointment with Meadows’s staff (as we were able to do successfully with District 10 Representative Patrick McHenry’s staff in Black Mountain), but Meadows’s office never responded to our requests. Since this is Meadows’s Main District Office, with published office hours of 9:00-5:00 M-F, we will deliver Resolutions at 3:00 and expect the office to be staffed at that time.*

For groups:

- **Print** as many copies as you think you need of page 3 only.
- At your gathering or event, have each of your participants **sign** a copy of the letter. As noted above, the following must be included:
 - **Signature**.
 - **Name** legibly printed.
 - Complete **mailing address** including zip code.
- Participants can make any **additional comments** they would like to include in the white space below their signature and address.
- **Collect** the signed letters.
- **Deliver** the letters in one of these ways:
 - **Scan and email** signed resolutions to info@indivisible.org by mid-day on Thursday, Jan. 3, 2018.
 - **OR: Bring them** (with folks from your group!) to our **“Whose House? Our House!” event** at The Block off Biltmore, 39 South Market Street, in downtown Asheville, from **5:30 PM to 7:00 PM on Thursday, Jan. 3, 2018**. We would love to see you there!
 - **OR: Mail them** to us at PO Box 593, Asheville, NC 28802. In order to allow time for delivery over the holidays the package should be postmarked by Dec. 31, 2018.
 - **OR: Bring them** directly to Representative Meadows’s office at the Henderson County Courthouse, 200 N. Grove Street, in Hendersonville no later than **2:30 PM on Friday, Jan. 4, 2018** and give them to the Indivisible AVL folks who will deliver them to a Meadows staffer.
- **THEN: Join us for a Rally** outside the District Office at **200 N. Grove Street in Hendersonville at 3:00 PM on Friday, Jan. 4**, when we deliver our Resolutions for our Congressman!

Dear Representative Meadows:

Recent events have made it clear that we need to **protect and strengthen our democracy**, which faces threats both internal and external. Therefore, **my New Year's Resolution for 2019 is that YOU, my Congressional Representative, will actively support H.R. 1, the Democracy Reform Act**, especially these Voter Empowerment and Access parts of the bill:

1. Creating fair Congressional representation through independent redistricting commissions, without gerrymandering by either party.
2. Restoring the Voting Rights Act.
3. Encouraging automatic and same-day voter registration, and providing adequate early voting opportunities.
4. Securing our election systems, such as but not limited to voting machines.

This is an opportunity for bipartisan cooperation that will protect our democracy, strengthen our voting processes and restore faith in our election results.
